1904 CLUB MEMBERSHIP

1904 Club membership criteria are intended to allow everyone to make their contribution to the next generation of leaders in South Africa. Whether a recent graduate or an established 'Captain of Industry', the 1904 Club is open to you.

CLUB RULES

- Each member must commit to a minimum of a single unit, requiring a monthly payment of £5
- Members can choose to subscribe to as many donor units as they would like and can afford
- Membership will remain open until all 1904 donor units are sold

A few years ago, Siyanda Centwa and his family were evicted from their mud hut and were not eligible for municipal housing. In the same year, Siyanda's sister was raped and murdered. But instead of giving up, Siyanda joined the Mfuzo Boxing Club, found a temporary job using his language skills as an interpreter at the High Court - and doggedly pursued the opportunity to study at Rhodes.

With an annual income of R3,500 per year, and a degree fee of R32,000, that looked unlikely – even impossible. He is now a BA Law student.
